Today 18 women in Australia will be told they have a gynaecological cancer and around six will die. Ovarian cancer is particularly deadly, claiming the lives of 63% of women who are diagnosed.

Improving life for these women with gynaecological cancer is why the Australia New Zealand Gynaecological Oncology Group (ANZGOG) was founded in 2000 by leaders in clinical research in Australia. ANZGOG is now the peak national research organisation for Australia and New Zealand.

Supported by donations from generous people, we are ensuring the latest and best treatments for women with ovarian, uterine, cervical, vaginal and vulvar cancer.

We do this by improving access to cutting-edge clinical trials conducted by our members, collaborating at over 60 centres locally and globally, helping define new standards of care.

Projects include pre-clinical research and clinical trials exploring the causes, prevention and treatment of gynaecological cancers. Researchers may focus on symptom benefits, quality of life and enhancing treatment outcomes for specific diseases such as ovarian cancer.

RESEARCHERS PIONEERING DISCOVERIES

Our generous ANZGOG supporters continue to support pioneering discoveries made by clinical researchers at the frontline like Professor Clare Scott. In the clinic and the laboratory, her focus is identifying the individual genes powering a woman's cancer cells, then working out how to switch them off.

She is currently leading an ANZGOG clinical trial called SOLACE2, exploring ways to engage a woman's own immune system to delay the recurrence of their ovarian cancer. Participants are receiving immunotherapy and other treatments to help shrink their tumours.

Professor Scott is looking for a biomarker to identify which women with ovarian cancer will respond to different treatments so their treatment can be personalised.

A WILL TO SAVE FUTURE GENERATIONS


Rose Varga lived life on her own terms, travelling Australia in a Kombi van with her husband Des after they arrived as refugees from Hungary. She also understood the urgency of research into ovarian cancer. She participated in several clinical trials and passed away at 81 years. Her belief in clinical trial research is making a lasting difference.

Rose left a gift in her Will and her generous legacy helped launch the OASIS Initiative – a world-class collaborative research program.

OASIS is short for Ovarian cancer Alliance for SIgnal-Seeking clinical trials. These trials are like scouting parties sent out to map the terrain ahead and show other researchers the way forward. Rose's gift has enabled a series of trials that personalise treatment for women affected by ovarian cancer.

THERE ARE DIFFERENT WAYS TO LEAVE ANZGOG A GIFT:

Residual – leaving the remainder of your estate after specific gifts have been disbursed

Pecuniary – nominating a specific dollar amount you would like to give

Percentage – giving a percentage of either the residue or your entire estate

A Specific Asset – examples are real estate, shares or bonds

We recommend you consult with your solicitor, provide them the following wording to include in your Will, and advise them of your preferred method of giving:

(For example, real estate, artworks, shares, units or other securities in listed companies.)

- To be applied for general purposes by ANZGOG as determined by its Directors. "I declare that the receipt of an authorised officer of ANZGOG will be sufficient discharge to my executors who will not be bound to see the application of the gift."

FUND FOR NEW RESEARCH - FOSTERING INNOVATION

Foster innovation with your gift. Support pioneering research projects that have the capability to lead to a significant clinical trial.

These are projects brought from the Australian and New Zealand research community to ANZGOG for funding to help make change.

Reviewed by research leaders and adopted as novel and innovative ideas warranting further work, individual grants up to \$100,000 are awarded annually for pre-clinical, pilot and feasibility studies that lead to a clinical trial. Research must be achievable and meet ANZGOG's strategic research priorities.

NEW TREATMENTS FOR OVARIAN CANCER

New genomic knowledge has radically changed the way we view ovarian cancer. We believe that OASIS is the best chance we have had in decades to improve the survival of Australian women with ovarian cancer.

OASIS is continuing to fundraise to add new clinical trials to the initiative. These are rapid trials, designed to identify new, targeted therapies and selected from the 'best of the best' proposals submitted by academic researchers, in a rigorous selection and governance process.

OASIS trials will be performed more affordably and more quickly, thereby making optimal use of philanthropic seed funding and providing a model for other cancer studies.
